Programs

Fall Fun Rally is a unique event. Many such programs would be put on by a collection of staff. But one of the most unique parts of Fall Fun Rally is that literally hundreds of people work together to put on the Fall Fun Rally, each taking a small part. This makes for an entirely diverse collection of events.

Most events on Saturday are centered around the Camp May Scoutcraft field. These events are largely organized by the Greater Saint Louis Area Council Venturing and Sea Scout Officers' Association, as well as some other VOAs from other Councils. Each event is planned and executed by volunteers: youth and adults from the different Crews, Ships, Posts who give part of their day to make amazing programs for all of us. The VSOA also coordinates bringing in multiple other displays, activities, and programs throughout the day put on by different people outside of Scouting. Finally, a great number of volunteers step forward to run different programs including Shooting Sports, Climbing Tower, Mountain Man Village, and STEM Area.

Most events are 'walk up and do' events with no advanced prep required. Competitions are grouped together in this program as they will require some preparation. Be sure to check out the trainings and presentations packet available at the website (www.fallfunrally.org) for other shorter programs running throughout the day.

Programs, unless noted, are open to both youth and adult participants.

With all these events, information is constantly changing about the event. As such, this booklet is current as of the date published, but will likely change prior to the event. Fall Fun Rally Color Run (8:00 am)– Join in the fun as we kick off the activities Saturday morning with a run through the Rally. The basic way a color run works is the runners will run through multiple stations where friends wait to throw clouds of color. The runners run through the clouds, and at the end come out covered in colors of the rainbow. It's a great fun run morning.

We'll need runners and throwers for this event. If you want to run, meet up at the parking area at the far end of the Lane Field (towards Shippey) by 8:00 am wearing a white t-shirt and other clothes you don't mind getting covered in color.

If you want to throw color, we'll have a limited amount of color available, but you as a unit can also join in the fun from your campsite as they run by. Those camping near the path through the field, or on the road will be able to throw a cloud of color for our runners.

Saturday Day Time Events – Large Events

(Largely Outside Field)

Career Fair – (Runs 1:00-4:30): Come check out these interactive displays from Eureka Fire, Spire, and Ameren. Whether you are interested in these careers or just want to check out some interactive displays this will be a great place to stop by this afternoon. *(Some exhibitors aren't fully confirmed)*

Climbing Complex – (Runs 9:00 - 4:30): Multiple sides of climbing are available and a bouldering wall. Come try out this great structure all day Saturday.

Horseback Trail Rides (4 rides available)– Put on your long pants (required) and join us for a trail ride with the Beaumont Herd and our very own Equestrian Venturing Crew. All tickets were pre-purchased during registration, but check at the registration desk for any cancellations.

Historical Reenactment Village (Runs 9:00 - 4:30) – A Fall Fun Rally favorite! Come down to the encampment and try your hands at Blacksmithing. Check out historical displays, crafts, and try out food that would have been made on the frontier. Additional reenactors this year include WWII, Elizabethan, and Vikings Reenactors. Top it all off with Tomahawk throwing. And don't forget some money to buy the famous homemade root beer! **NEW this year will be a chuckwagon!**

Metro Air Support Helicopter Landing – Landing in the Parade Field (flag field) will be the Metro Air Support helicopter. This is the regional police helicopter for St. Louis City and County. Chat with the team and find out about their critical mission.

Mud Cave (Runs 9:00 - 4:00)– Beaumont has its own cave. Yes that's right, just at the edge of the property. Go in, explore the cave, whether you want to get muddy or not, there's plenty to explore. Follow the signs to the cave and be sure to bring two lights with you.

STEM Area (Runs 9:00 - 4:30) – This area is going to be packed with exciting explorations of Science Technology Engineering and Math. The STEM Trailer will be there with all the 3D printing, Welding, CAD design, and Laser Cutting. Inside Emerson will be a small planetarium too. Outside there will be a great welding activity. Stop by and try out the fun, or check out how you can bring STEM activities to your unit through the NOVA Awards Program.

Range and Target Activities (Runs 9:00 - 4:00)– We've got so many shooting sports going on you could spend the whole day just doing this. Some activities will have an orientation that must be completed prior to participating.

- .22 Rifles (Morning) – Standard Bolt Action Rifles (Morning only)
- Cowboy Action (Afternoon) – Try your hand at shooting like a cowboy. In quick succession try Lever Action Rifle, Pistol, and Shotgun (Afternoon only)
- Shotgun – Try out our shotgun range, located next to the .22 range.
- Archery – Come shoot a bow and arrow. We've got a range of targets to aim at.
- Sporting Arrows –Combine Archery with the fun of skeet shooting, and that's Action Archery. Shoot down the targets as they fly across the range.

All youth shooting need a permission slip/waiver signed by a parent or guardian to participate in shooting sports.

Saturday Daytime Activities – District/Unit Sponsored Activities

(Largely in Field)

Events run all day, in the Activities Field unless otherwise noted. Items marked with a * have available competitions which will have a prize announced the closing show.

A-frame Shuffle – Lash up an A-Frame with your team and see if you can walk the frame (with a person on it) across the field.

Backyard Games – We'll have an area with all our favorite backyard games: Ladder Ball, Frisbee Slam, Corn Hole, KanJam, Croquet, Horseshoes and more! Come play one game or play them all!

Bounce House – Jump up, jump down, jump all around. You know the drill, come have a good time!

Branding (Morning) – We've got brands galore this year. Bring your items to brand to the branding area and go home 'marked' with Venturing, FFR, or other scouting themed brands for the weekend.

Car Show (Morning) – Check out the classic cars that make the trip down. Talk to the owners and find out about the history of their cars.

Cookoff (Morning) – Think you've got what it takes to take home the bacon? Or to win the cooking competitions? That's right, there's three categories this year.

Crate Stacking – Build a tower of milk crates as tall as you can. Oh, and do that while you are climbing up them. That's crate stacking. Let's see how high you can go.

Gaming Corner – Stop by and play some board games. We'll be gaming all day so come by for a round or stay for the whole day!

Giant Games – We've got some of our favorite games, only BIGGER! Chess, Connect Four, Twister, and more!

HAM Radio – Get on the airwaves and talk to people from across the country and around the world. We'll also be running a Fox'n Hound search event. Stop by Beckett and check out the new Beaumont HAM HQ!

Ice Block Sledding (Afternoon)– Grab a block of ice, throw a pad on top and take a wild ride down the hill.

Ice Tie Dying – Bring a tshirt or any other cotton and try out this tie dye method.

Junkyard Regatta* (3:00 PM) – Build a boat, cross the simulated pool. Teams report at 3:00 to start building, and ships will start trying to cross the simulated pool around 3:30. Rules later in this packet.

Land Skiing – Test the teamwork and coordination of your fellow Venturers in order to cross country ski with one pair of skis, on land.

Marine Corps League Fitness Challenge – Come meet with these former Marines and see if you're up to the physical fitness challenge they are bringing!

Music Percussion Wall – Check out the music percussion wall, a brand new event from Adventure Summit. The area includes: two octaves of boom sticks; handbells; and a wall made out of pots, pans, lids, buckets, and blocks.

Paracord Bracelets – Come on down, learn how to make a paracord bracelet and take it home.

Sea Scout Challenge -- Do you have what it takes to cut it on some of these challenges from Sea Scouting? The Titanic Challenge, Real Rescue Skills, and River Voyage challenge all await you in this exciting area!

SCUBA Display – Interested in SCUBA? Want to find out some local resources to do get SCUBA Certified?

Search for Scoutlantis – Travel around multiple events in order to find the final event on your quest, Scoutlantis! Look for more information at the event on how to begin this challenge!

Slack Line Spectacular – Try your hand at this sport which is a mix between walking a tightrope and a trampoline. We'll have a couple different setups for this fun activity.

Slip'n Slide Kickball (Afternoon)– Combine Slip'n Slides, Kickball, and a whole lot of fun as you slide into pools for the bases. It's bound to be a great time.

Squeeze Box – See how low you can go. Try to squeeze through to get to the other side.

Stop the Bleed – This informative activity shows you what to do when faced with a situation of a serious bleed. This course is being taught widely by Wilderness First Aid Instructors and takes around 45 minutes. It will be offered at 9:00, 11:00, 1:00 and 3:30.

Tallest Tower – Let's see how tall your team can build a tower. And no, this isn't just basic building, we've got everything but blocks for you to build.

Trident Ring Toss* (Morning) – In the grand theme of Scoutlantis, toss a ring buoy on the trident. Top score for youth and adults wins a prize.

Underwater Knot Tying* (Afternoon) – Welcome to the Atlantis Maintenance Crew. Your job is to secure the ropes that keep Atlantis from floating to the surface. Fastest time for youth and adults wins a prize.

Water Rockets (Morning) –How high can air pressure launch a 'rocket' with just water? Let's find out. We might even try and calculate the altitude using some basic math!

V-Box – While the Squeeze Box is a flat surface to crawl through, the V-Box simulates the up and down you would do in a small cave.

Wilderness First Aid Challenge – Come test your First Aid skills in a realistic setting. We're building a mock disaster and you get to treat members of the EZ Squad to see how you do. You will need a team of 4 or more to win an awesome prize! See the flier in your registration packet for more information

Saturday Displays

SCUBA Opportunities – Though we couldn't have SCUBA at the FFR this year, that doesn't mean that you and your unit can't participate in SCUBA throughout the year. Stop by the booth and find out about opportunities such as SCUBA certification, SCUBA Awards, and yes even SCUBA Diving Merit Badge.

Summit Bechtel Reserve – The newest of Scouting's National High Adventure Bases, The Summit is your place for all sorts of High Adventure. Whether it's a week long Range and Target Activities camp, or a week full of adventures like Zip Lines and White Water, they've got a little bit of everything. Come talk to the representative from the Summit and find out what adventure awaits you and your unit!

Wood Badge – Learn about the national leadership training just for volunteers in Scouting, aged 18 and up. Yes, that means older Venturers and Sea Scouts could also attend and learn about Listening, Managing Conflict, Leading Change, Stages of Team Development, Coaching and Mentoring, Leadership for different stages, Servant Leadership, Project Planning and More! Two courses are offered annually in Greater St. Louis, so check out the program and opportunities coming up.

World Scout Jamboree – Every four years the world of Scouting gathers at a World Scout Jamboree. If you attend the WSJ in Poland in 2027, you'll meet Scouts from around the world. And with all your new international friends you'll participate in hundreds of activities from aquatics to high adventure, from shows to patch trading, and everything in between more than 25,000 people are expected to descend on the Jamboree and have the adventure of a lifetime!

Scoutlantis Cooking Contests

This year we are expanding our cooking contests. We've got multiple categories for you to choose:

- **Cast Iron Cooking:** For this competition, any ingredients are allowed, so long as your entry is fully cooked on Beaumont property and only on cookware made of cast iron.
- **Solar Oven Experiments:** For this competition, any ingredients are allowed, so long as your entry is fully cooked on Beaumont property using a solar oven.
- **Mystery Ingredient:** For this competition, any ingredients are allowed, so long as your entry is fully cooked on Beaumont property through any cooking method. Be warned. The judges will hand you a mystery item at 9 AM that must be included in your submission.

All contests may have teams of up to four people to complete. There will be youth and adult categories for each of the above contests. If a team has more than one person that is more than aged 21, they will be included in the Adult Category.

Sip 'n Sync

There will be an awesome lip sync competition at lunch time at the Fall Fun Rally. Get a group together and pick your song you'd like to perform. For the finals, we'll assign your song for you. Youth/Adult teams are acceptable, as long as there is a majority of youth on the team for competitive teams. Songs must be considered 'Scout Appropriate', as must the actions accompanying the songs. Scout Appropriate means no bad language of any type, nor anything vulgar or lewd. Teams may select a portion of a song, instead of the full song (in fact this may be preferable, as it may highlight the best part of the act), but each lip sync must be at least one minute (preferably less than three minutes also).

Wilderness First Aid Challenge

Scouts and Explorers know all about first aid, so this one shouldn't be a big challenge, right? Try again! This realistic, hands on scenario based competition is a great test of your skills. Get a team together and compete for their top notch prizes too provided by the EZ Squad! More info on this competition is available later in this packet or on the Fall Fun Rally website.

Fall Fun Rally's Got Talent

You and or your group can showcase any form of talent (scout appropriate). You may be good enough to make it as one of our top talent groups showing your stuff in front of all Fall Fun Rally participants on Saturday Night.

You may participate as an individual or as a team. There is no limit as to the number of entries per post or crew. Each group may have one adult in a supporting role of the youth who will be the main performers.

Preliminary judging will be at 1:15 PM on Saturday in the field following sip'n sync. Please sign up on Friday night at the elections or at registration on Saturday.

Five or less acts will advance to the finals. The show committee will choose the top acts from all participants.

Check back in on Saturday by 5PM to see if your team made it to the finals. Judging of the winner of will be done by the crowd and judges at the awards and slideshow on Saturday Night.

Each act is limited to 4 total minutes. This time limit includes any needed set up time your act may require. If recorded music is to be used, it must be on CD format, or readily available on streaming services like Spotify.

Acts must perform the same act that they performed earlier in the day. Variations from this act during the live performance will result in the termination of the performance, and any act proceeding longer than 4 minutes will result in an immediate end of the act.

NO PROFANITY OR GRAPHIC LANGUAGE OR INAPPROPRIATE DRESS CAN BE USED IN ANY TALENT ACT. INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE STAFF. REMEMBER THAT THIS IS A SCOUTING EVENT!

Table Top Presentation

Tabletop presentations have become a part of the Venturing Program, required for many part of the advancement program. We'll do the displays on the porch of the Emerson Center Dining Hall. In conjunction with the theme for the Rally, we will be awarding prizes in multiple categories:

- The adventure of your unit: What does your unit do that is amazing?'
- Your personal Adventure: What have you learned, what projects have you completed. This would include presentations for requirements for the Ranger Award or other recognitions.
- The adventure of the Fall Fun Rally: Between your unit, put together a display showcasing Fall Fun Rally for you.
- Presentation for any of the awards that have tabletop awards as an option.

Presentations will be judged on their content and presentation. Presentations will need to be in place by 10 AM on Saturday morning (can be up Friday night), and can remain up through Saturday Night.

Fall Fun Rally Regatta

Think what would have happened if Tom Sawyer had met a backwoods engineer with a trailer full of camping supplies and had to cross a fake shallow body of water, that is the Camp May Regatta!

Bring your Crew, Troop, Ship, Post, or whatever, along with some creativity, duct tape, style, and some fun and see if you will be our champion. Raid your trailer, find those water jugs, skate boards, floor boards, folding tables, and make a legend happen!

Who – All Crews, Troops, Ships, and Posts at Fall Fun Rally

What – A competition between units to build a vessel while at Fall Fun Rally and be able to move as many people as possible across a make believe body of water (a really big tarp). Think of it as the most epic game of the floor is lava that must be done with style!!!!

Where – In the field next to the Pool.

When – You can start assembling at the pool at 3:00 and we will running heats between 3:30 and 4:30

Why – WHY NOT!

RULES:

- Vessel must be constructed at Fall Fun Rally and cannot be pre-manufactured
- Vessel must not cause any damage to the participants
- Vessel must be carried/pulled by the team to the launch point. It must be able to be launched by the submitting team under human power
- Each participant must wear a costume supporting your theme
- It must be able to be launched by the submitting team under human power
- Each participant must wear a costume supporting your theme
- Vessel must roll or glide across the tarp, while minimizing human touch of the tarp surface (floor is lava rules)

SCORING:

- One point awarded for vessel crossing the make believe body of water
- One point awarded for each participant on the vessel at the time of crossing
- One point awarded for following all the “rules” from above
- One point awarded if your group has a theme, including costumes (ie Washington crossing the Delaware)
- One point if there is music coming from your vessel
- One point if your design includes a disco ball
- One point deduction for each person who touches the tarp.
- One point for Epic-ness!

What do you win – Other than bragging rites of being the winners of what is sure to be an amazing annual event that your children will some day talk about?

Trainings

Join us throughout the weekend for discussion sessions, demonstrations, and training courses. Sessions are approximately one hour in length, unless otherwise noted. The main activity field is officially known as the 'Scoutcraft Field'.

Saturday

Multiple Stop the Bleed (Pavilion at back of Scoutcraft)

STOP THE BLEED is a national campaign and training to encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped, and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives. Offered at 9:30, 11:00, 2:00, 3:30 or any time a crowd demands it.

9:00 Photography (Emerson Dining Hall)

Come learn how to turn your pictures into photographs that say 'wow'!

10:00 Astronomy (Emerson Dining Hall)

Come learn about Astronomy in this day time session. Stars, constellations, and how to observe at home. We'll also be showing off the council's new planetariums.

10:00 Venturing's Advancement System (Large Tent)

Did you know Venturing has an advancement system just like Scouts BSA & Cub Advancement Scouting? Come learn about the requirements and how to Rank Up from the National Venturing Officers.

11:00 How to Survive the End of the Roman Empire (Dining Hall)

How prepared are you for the End of the Roman Empire? Oh right, that already happened, but how about an Earthquake, Flood, Fire, or just a power outage. Let's talk about simple steps we can all do to be a bit more prepared.

1:00 Venturing Summer Camp (Scoutcraft Gazebo)
